Dr. Jacob H. Bronstein was born in Memphis on August 29, 1897 the son of Samuel and Esther Bronstein. He received his education in the Memphis public schools, attending Market Street School, now know as Christine School, and Central High School, going from there to the University of Pennsylvania, at Philadelphia, where he received his B.S. and M.D. degrees. His offices are in the Exchange Building.

In 1919, he married Miss Betty Clark, of Philadelphia, and the couple has two children, Maury Williford, 8, who is in the third grade at Maury School, and Roberta Barbara, 7, who attends the same school. The Bronsteins live at 216 Avalon.
