## Louis Dubrovner

## (Deceased)

Louis Dubrovner, one of the most ardent workers in the Arbeiter Farband was born in Russia in 1897. He came to Memphis with his parents Reverend and Mrs. Aaron Dubrovner at the age of eight. He received his education in the Memphis schools and studied law at the Memphis Law School. He practised law for a short time and was later superintendent of Bry-Block Mercantile Co. and was later affiliated with Perel and Lowenstein.

Mr. Dubrovner was a member of the Arbeiter Farband, Baron Hirsch Congregation, Sam Schloss Lodge of the B'nai B'rith and of Lodge No. 18 F. & A. M. Masonic Order and was the founder of the Young Poale Zion Club of Memphis and worked with them as their leader. He was also actively interested in the Zionist movement and shortly before his death he had undertaken the study of Hebrew with the purpose in mind of going to Palestine.

He had a rare gift of leadership and had the capacity of performing splendid service as a worker. Altho Mr. Dubrovner was not a wealthy man he gave freely of his resources to any worthy cause. Time or effort were never considered in any of his work, but only the purpose of promoting the cause which was so dear to him.

He died on May 7, 1932 and was survived by his wife, Mrs. Shirley Pattenoy Dubrovner and two children, Rosalind and Raphael.
