Mitchell H. Rosenthal was born in Memphis, Tennessee, in 1867, the son of Hyman and Sophie Rosenthal. He died in 1930, still a young man, and one whose loss was deeply felt by the entire Jewish community.

Mr. Rosenthal received his education in the Memphis public schools, and after leaving school, became interested in the laundry and dry cleaning business. He was one of the organizers of the Model-Bluff City Laundry, and of Kraus and Co.

His wife, the former Belle Salinger, survives him, as does one son, Mitchell Rosenthal, Jr. A daughter, Amy Rosenthal Katz, died during the first influenza epidemic, in 1917. A sewing circle, which meets weekly at the B'nai B'rith Home, is named in her honor.

Mr. Rosenthal was an influential member and steady worker in the Congregation Children of Israel, Sam Schloss Lodge of the B'nai B'rith, B. P. O. E., the Masonic order, and the Federation of Jewish Welfare Agencies board. His charitable and philanthropic work covered a wide field in the city of his birth.
